

IDEA

PROYECTOR 2008-2016. International Videoart Festival will take place from **5th to 9th October 2016** in **Madrid** and it will have several screenings along the year in other cities of **Spain, Italy, Portugal, Mexico, France, Colombia, Peru, Macau**, always with the participation of artists, curators and festivals from all over the world.

For the program of its **9th edition** there will be videoinstallations (single-channel, multi-channel, interactive), interventions, screenings in public spaces, performances, workshops, videodance and seminars.

PROYECTOR's aim is to generate a space where the most new and recent audiovisual expression is taking place. Therefore, it is a space of visibility for the artist, in the sense that he or she is recognized in his or her own location. That means that we work in connection with public space, which is understood as a political instrument for civic contest, militancy and empowerment.

According to this, **PROYECTOR** is born from the intersection of two concepts:

An international selection with a contemporary and panoramic view that includes, in one hand, the relation between countries from the centre and from the periphery inside videoart production and, in the other hand, the most recent conceptual and formal experimentation.

A choice of screening and show spaces with the aim to get the contents to the public. We consider the street, independent spaces and artists ateliers as the most close emplacements in the city to the citizen.

Therefore **PROYECTOR** wants to fortify the transforming capacity of the artistic expression through the visual language.


